A note from Rev. Wanda

Dear friends in Christ

I am writing this on Ash Wednesday. The church is bustling with visitors, bible study gathering, coffee perking, and in the distance, the train is whistling. In short it's just another day, but it's also not.

Ash Wednesday is a day we come together humbly and remember something we all share in common: we were born, we live, and then we die.

We can't escape the reality of our mortality. We try though, don't we? I try! I'm nursing a bad knee right now because I keep forgetting that my body is not 20 years old any more. So many of us feel young inside and wonder at the number on our birthday cards!

If we can strip our lives down to such a basic truth, and live with that truth daily, "From dust we came, and to dust we will return"... does that change anything for you?

This year the theme through Lent is "deepest desire". What is your deepest motivation? For many of us, we don't like to talk about the things we want, because we feel we should be thinking about others. And while that's true, it's also really important to recognize the desires God has placed on our human, mortal, fragile hearts, and ask ourselves ... why?

How is God asking me to to serve the world through this yearning or desire that I have? How does it meet a need in the world?

Lent is a time to peel off the layers society encourages us to wear, and to accept that deep down, we all share a common destiny, but the journey toward that destiny is different for each of us. Our desires are God's calling card, if you will! They are the way we connect most deeply with the one who made us, and the one who loves us. By living out from your deepest, authentic desires, you are honouring God, and freeing yourself from the constraints of this world. So what is your deepest desire? God has given us all this beautiful life for a

purpose, and the desires within reveal God's work on our hearts.

Sure, give up chocolate if you have to. Give up beer or wine and disrupt your life as a daily reminder that we are in Lent... but let that disruption lead you to a deep truth that can change your journey in a powerful, life-giving way. Blessings as you engage this season with curiosity and honesty. And don't forget that I am a phone call, text or email away if you are surprised by what you

discover!

How to Have 20/25 Vision

O Lord, why do you make me see wrongdoing and look at trouble? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. ... Then the Lord answered me and said: There is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come; it will not delay. – Habakkuk 1:3, 2:3 (NRSV)

My Grampa Phinney was a health nut. Long before hippies existed (which he, an engineer with his crisp white button-down and pocket protectors, never became), he trumpeted the benefits of mega-doses of vitamin C and apple cider vinegar.

He was also certain he knew how to prevent the vision loss that comes with aging. His daily practice: to hold a pencil vertically about 2 feet in front of his face, and toggle between focusing on the pencil and focusing on the farthest thing his eye could see. He himself never wore glasses, even well into old age.

Grampa's advice works metaphorically for these tempestuous times. Lots of us are on a news diet ... but to look away from what is happening far from us is to abdicate responsibility for far-flung people who are suffering, and deserve compassion and advocacy. But then again, if we *only* look far away, we get overwhelmed and shut down. The human psyche has not evolved to take in so many threats far beyond our immediate neighborhood.

Toggling between near and far, á la Grampa, is the exercise that may keep our vision (and sanity) intact. Look far, look near. Look far, look near.

God, you still have a vision that extends beyond the current global landscape of destruction and violence, strife and contention. You make us see wrongdoing so we may do our part to right it. You also help us look close to home in equal measure: at the joy and peace right in hand, right in our 'hood.

You don't have to be new to our church to benefit from this exploration into the faith, justice,



Affirm and Equity Terminology for March: Three big gender rights victories in Thailand, India and France.

In recent news about global human rights, Thailand has extended free hormone therapy to nearly two thirds of the country's transgender population. A government spokesperson noted the country's growing acceptance of the trans and non -binary community and the approval of ~ £3M in its budget to go towards health services, including hormone therapy, for its trans citizens. The budget will aim to support 200,000 transgender people out of an estimated 314,000 trans people living in the country.


In other news, India's Supreme Court has declared access to clean, gendersensitive public toilets a fundamental right and Europe's top court has protected women's bodily autonomy in marriage by ruling against forced marital relations in France.



It is important to reflect on these positive changes as they provide hope that many countries are continuing to support human rights for all citizens.

175th Anniversary Shirts for Sale




But don't be intimidated by all those instructions! It can be a joyful, profoundly important way to pray and let God speak to us.
